Dave Wickerham returns this fall . . .



On Sunday September 29 our featured silent film will be 'The Freshman' starring Harold Lloyd and Jobyna Ralston. The Freshman is a comedy about a young college freshman (Lloyd) trying to become popular by joining the school's football team and to impress his

new romantic friend Peggy (Jobyna). One of the film's title cards describes Peggy as "the kind of girl your mother must have been."

The Freshman remains one of Lloyd's most hilarious and successful films. In 1990 it was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry by the Library of Congress as being 'culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant.'

Tour of Blackwood on Sunday June 23

On Sunday June 23 a guided tour of the Blackwood estate will be presented for those who have never learned about the history of its unique structures and instruments. You will be guided through the transformation of Blackwood from its beginnings in 1970 with the purchase of 16 acres of abandoned farmland through all of the changes made over the last five decades.

After the main house was built in 1976 the following structures were built: The Spring House, which sits above the natural spring water supply for the property and its overflow which is the source for the beautiful pond and fountain; The 70 ft tall Clock Tower, a four-story residence which houses not only a fully restored 1907 Seth Thomas Tower Clock but also the original Schulmerich carillon formerly installed in Old Main at Slippery



Rock University; The recreation room which houses a 1906 Wurlitzer Military Band Organ, originally built to draw attention to the carousel in amusement parks; and finally the beautiful music room where the 1200 pipe Mighty Theater Pipe Organ will be demonstrated. This will be a special treat for those who have never been to Blackwood. There you hear a selection of music performed by the finest theater organists on this instrument via our unique midi playback system. This will be a walking tour lasting about two hours so be sure to wear comfortable shoes.


